BREAD

LAE AND PORT MORESBY

Made by the price Controller under the provisions of the Prices Regulation Act 1949, as amended to date, to

come into operation on the date of publication in the National Gazette.

1. CITATION.

This Order may be cited as Prices Order No. 154.

2. REVOCATION.

Prices Order No. 134 and Prices Order No. 135 are hereby revoked.

3. DEFINITIONS.

In this Order-

"bread" means a product obtained by baking a yeast leavened dough prepared with flour and water with or without other ingredients;

"ordinary bread" means bread made into loaves other than starch-reduced bread, protein-increased bread or milk bread as defined in this Order or fancy bread;

"milk bread" means bread which is made into loaves and which contains no less than four parts per centum

by weight of non-fat milk solids calculated on the water-free substance;

"starch-reduced bread" or "protein increased bread" means bread which is made into loaves and which

contains not less than two and seven-tenths parts per centum by weight of nitrogen calculated on the water-free substance;

"unwrapped" in relation to the sale of any bread means that such bread is not wrapped as defined in this Order;

"wrapped" means in relation to the sale of any bread that such bread is fully enclosed prior to delivery to

the place at which the bread is sold by retail, in waxed or grease-proof paper, cellulose film, polythene or

other similar wrapping and that such bread was so enclosed when sold;

"foil-wrapped" means in relation to the sale of any bread that such bread is fully enclosed prior to delivery

to the place at which the bread is sold by retail, in aluminium or other foil, and that such bread was

so enclosed when sold.

4. MEASUREMENT OF WEIGHT.

Where, in this Order, the maximum price fixed is related to the weight of bread, the weight is to be measured

when the bread is cold.

5. MAXIMUM PRICE.

The maximum price at which bread included in a category described in the first column of the Schedule to this

Order may be sold by wholesale and retail in the cities of Lae and Port Moresby is the price specified in the second

column of that Schedule opposite to the description of that category.

6. DISPLAY OF PRICES.

A person or organisation engaged in selling bread by retail in the Cities of Lae and Port Moresby, shall dis-

play in each of their places of business, in prominent positions and in large clear and legible figures, the types of

bread loaves covered by this Order and the prices at which such loaves may be bought.

Made by the Deputy Price Controller under the provisions of the Prices Regulation Aet-1949, as amended to

date, to come into operation on the date of publication in the National Gazette.

1. CITATION.

This Order may be cited as Prices Order No. 155.

2. REVOCATION.

The Prices Orders specified in Schedule 2 of this Order are revoked.

DEFINITIONS.

In this Order-

"petrol" includes any substance normally sold as petrol whether or not containing additives of any kind;

"distillate" includes any substance normally sold as automotive distillate whether or not containing additives of any kind;

"kerosene" includes any substance normally sold as kerosene being a medium refined petroleum product as

used for lighting and cooking in home appliances, whether or not containing additives of any kind;

"wholesaler" in relation to petrol, distillate or lighting kerosene means a person or a firm who sells petrol,

distillate or lighting kerosene for the purpose of resale and not for the purpose of use;

"supplier" in relation to petrol, distillate or lighting kerosene, means a person or a firm who sells petrol,

distillate or lighting kerosene for the purpose of use; "retail" means for the purpose of consumption or use.

4. MAXIMUM PRICE.

- (i) Subject to Subclause (ii) of this clause, where petrol, distillate or kerosene is supplied-
- (a) at a locality specified in the first column of Schedule I to this Order; or
- (b) at some other place at which the petrol, distillate or lighting kerosene is transported from any such locality by or on behalf of a wholesaler, or supplier;

the maximum price per gallon at which the petrol, distillate or kerosene may be supplied is the sum of—

- (c) the maximum retail selling price specified in the Second, Third or Fourth Column as the case may be, of Schedule I in relation to the locality concerned; and
- (d) the amount (if any) charged for the transport referred to in paragraph (b) of this subclause.

(ii) Where the maximum price of any quantity of petrol, distillate or kerosene supplied at any one time, cal—culated in accordance with Subclause (i) of this clause is an amount involving a fraction of a toea, the supplier may charge to the next whole toea.

5. SUPPLY TO GOVERNMENT ETC.

Nothing in this Order applies to or relates to the supply of petrol, distillate or kerosene to the Government or instrumentality or authority of the Government.

6. DISPLAY OF PRICES.
